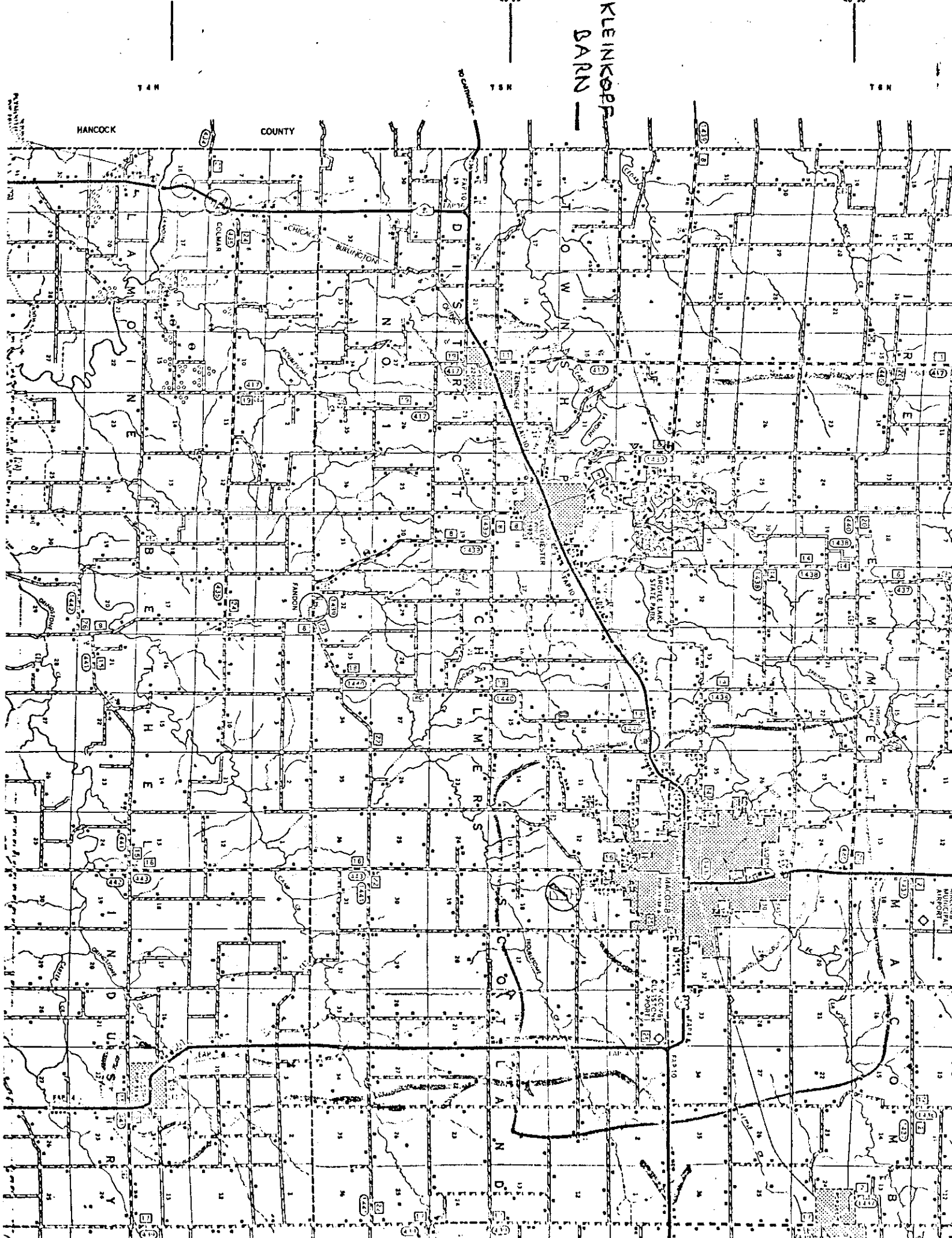

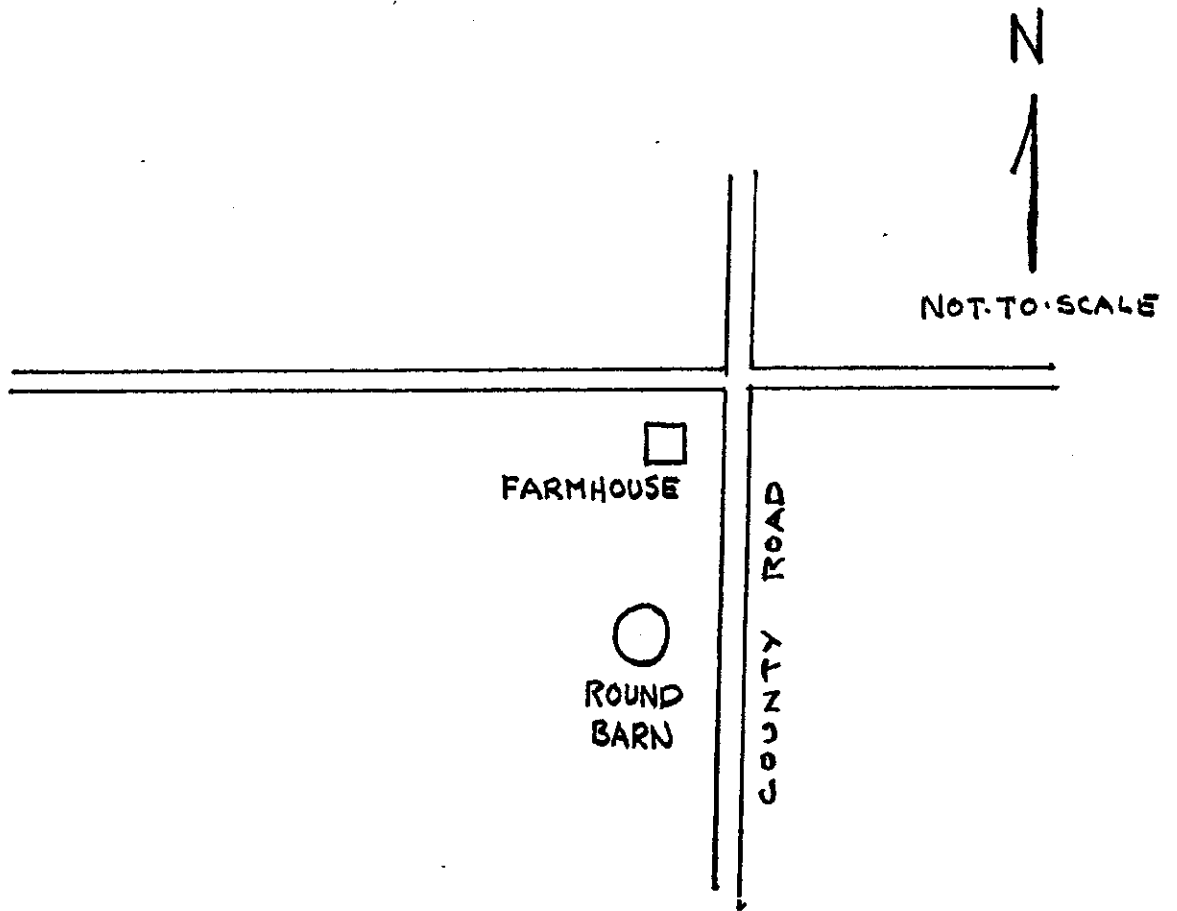

Section 7 - Description

This 56 foot diameter barn rests on a poured concrete foundation and is covered with *horizontal* wooden siding. It has a single-hip roof with wooden shingles. The main entrance is on the west side. Secondary entrances are on the south and northwest quadrants of the barn. A centrally located wooden silo necessitates a semi-circular driveway between entrances. A metal ventilator tops the barn 40 feet above grade. The haymow starts at roof level and extends three-quarters of the way round the barn.

The barn is in excellent condition. It has all its original building materials and no alterations have been made.

Section 8 - Significance The barn is significant as a representative Illinois example embodying "the characteristics of a type" (36CFR Part 60.4c).

History:

It was built by a local carpenter, Dick Carmack, for George Welch; and it is the lone survivor of three round barns built by Carmack within a two-mile radius (Kleinkopf to Sculle, 19 August 1981).
